Name of Project: *The Roxby Games* – short art film

Project Director: Emmaline Zanelli

1. What is the project about?

This project is a creative short film that explores what it is like to live in Roxby Downs as a young person. This project is supported by the University of South Australia's Samstag Art Museum and the Adelaide Film Festival. Emmaline is an artist, photographer, and workshop facilitator based in Adelaide. She is interested in themes of family, work, humour and daily life. She is a co-director of South Australian arts and music collective The Bait Fridge, a company that has worked nationally with children and young people around Australia on various collaborative arts projects with outcomes ranging from a car turned into a crocodile and a video where kids run a news station in Arnhem Land, to a 12-metre public fountain made from local trash in Mt Gambier. This new project comes from Emmaline's personal interest in the area of Olympic Dam and Roxby Downs through her FIFO family members who have worked at Olympic Dam.

2. What are the activities involved?

The project will involve young people learning to use a camera to record video and sound in creative ways, developing stories from life experience, interviews with community members, and combining these skills with other interests/abilities such as music or BMX. These activities will be facilitated by Emmaline and other invited artists. These activities will be run at the Youth Centre, and at the Area School. For any students at the Area School participating, you will receive a separate copy of this form to return via the school.

3. When is the project happening?

The project will be taking place from September 2023 - mid 2024, across several workshop sessions. Each workshop session will be advertised via the Youth Centre, or via the Area School. Young people may also be given either a sound recorder or a handycam to use to work on skills and ideas.

4. What is the outcome?

The outcome will be an abstract/artistic short film (approximately 10 minutes) that uses creative metaphors such as The Olympic Games and popular games or movies and techniques including stop motion animation to explore what it is like to live in Roxby Downs. The artwork will be shown in the University of South Australia's Samstag Art Museum gallery in Adelaide, during October and November 2024.

5. What are the benefits?

Participants will:

- **Gain technical skills** through learning to use camera, sound, and lighting equipment
- **Build confidence** and agency through meeting new people, sharing their point of view with others, and having a platform to show others their town and life.
- **Develop teamwork skills** through working with peers and workshop facilitators
- **Be exposed to professional artists and workshop facilitators** from Adelaide who work both with young people and in the arts nationally, providing new creative perspectives and ideas

- Any/all adults involved in this project will be required to provide a valid Working With Children Check.
- This project won't use the faces or names of any young people, or names and faces of people that they record or film, unless clear permission is given and confirmed in writing. This form does not give permission for your child's name or face to be used in the project, or the names or faces of people that your child may film during the project./
